2021 Annual Review – Community Development Plan

Chair's Message

Why is it important to have a Community Development Plan for Garve & District?

Having a good, up to date plan means the community has the backing it needs when tackling projects – whether those be completely new ideas or long-standing aspirations, or issues that force change. And it has been a year of big changes: -

- Continued lockdowns, social distancing and restrictions.
- Huge increase in visitors in our area campervans, cyclists, walkers.
- Doing everything online from zoom, payments, forms, emails, surveys if you didn't do it before you will be now.
- Financial strain for many.
- Concerns about mental wellbeing.

The information contained in the Community Development Plan can be used by anyone or any group – but particularly by The Garve & District Development Company board and staff – to guide their work and set priorities. It is why we are very grateful for your responses when we come to you with ideas on garve.org or send out surveys. All opinions count, and over the last year we have been paying particular attention to how we store and use information generally and all the associated issues around privacy and security.

You don't have to be a member of The Garve & District Development Company to have a say in the plan, but we would strongly encourage all residents to sign up. Individuals, rather than households, are members and it is free! Sometimes it means we have a better chance of getting outside funding or participating in wider projects if we can demonstrate a strong community base. It has been great to see new people moving in and signing up.

The Covid Pandemic has inevitably meant constraints on progress on some community projects – but we have managed to get a lot done despite this. Like the Development Company, our sister community groups Lochluichart Community Trust and Garve and District Community Council have carried on working largely online. We have seen increasing joint working on varied issues where each group contributes in its area of expertise or relevance, and I think the community has seen better and quicker outcomes as a result.

We have seen work starting on new projects such as the overlapping strands of paths, cycling, walking and community transport; there has been interest in the community buying land and the associated work required for "due diligence".

Patience has been required as we see some things slowing down or put on hold – the Garve Public Hall refurbishment has been held up; as were some aspects of "Green for Go" where our Energy Officer is working on helping households to improve home energy efficiency.

Covid has thrown up areas of work which we wouldn't otherwise have been considering - community support grants, measures to keep our public spaces Covid safe and online activities rather than social gatherings in our village halls. We now have outside funding to continue our Covid Response and Recovery Co-ordinator role into next year.

That we are able to tackle these many and varied projects is made possible by our skilled team of staff – truly they are multi-talented and multi-tasking.

This past year has seen the move online hastened. We are so fortunate that thanks to the hard work of the Broadband Group in recent years, together with LCT money, this community already had access to superfast broadband just when it was needed the most. As it seems that we are looking at a future home working revolution it is an example of how investing in the community can bring positive outcomes.

Not everyone is comfortable with the increasing trend towards doing everything online and Zoom doesn't work for everything! It really will be good to get back to face to face conversations.

It has been a year of continued progress and positivity, but none of this would have been possible without our residents. Thank you all for continuing to support your community, Garve & District, whether as volunteers, submitting comments, ideas, criticism, they are all important.

The Garve & District Development Company Directors, Staff and Volunteers look forward to working with you all during 2021/2022.
